TIMELINE

- 1754 Royal Charter establishes King's College under King George II of England.
- 1784 Renamed Columbia College by New York State Legislature.
- 1857 College moves from Park Place, near the present City Hall, to 49th and Madison.
- 1864 Students enter the School of Mines, now The Fu Foundation School of Engineering and Applied Science.
- 1889 Barnard College becomes an affiliate of Columbia.
- 1896 Trustees formally designate Columbia as a university.
- 1897 The University moves to its present site in Morningside Heights.
- 1928 Opening of the Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center, the first to combine teaching, research, and patient care.
- 1947 Nevis Laboratories is founded in Irvington, New York, offering facilities for experimental physics research.
- 1949 The Lamont-Doherty Earth Observatory opens in Palisades, New York.
- 1983 The first Columbia College class to include women arrives on campus in September.
- 2002 Lee C. Bollinger begins term as Columbia's 19th president.
- 2004 Commemoration of Columbia's 250th anniversary.
- 2006 The Columbia Campaign launched; totals exceed \$6.1B at its close in 2013.
- 2012 Construction begins on the first Manhattanville campus building.

LIBRARIES

Columbia University Libraries/Information Services is an innovative organization that integrates research library functions with key elements of academic technology services. Ranking as one of the top five academic library systems in the North America, the collections include over 12 million volumes, over 160,000 current journals and serials, and an extensive collection of electronic resources, manuscripts, rare books, microforms, maps, and graphic and audiovisual materials. Services and collections are organized into 21 libraries and various academic technology centers, including affiliates, and employs more than 450 professional and support staff.
